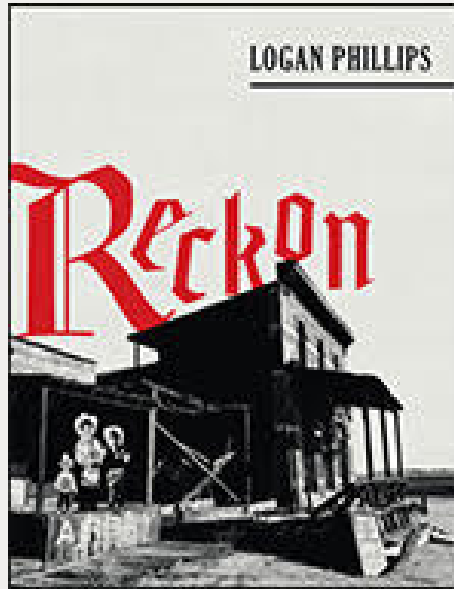

Logan Phillips

Logan Phillips, a writer, performer and cultural worker, was appointed Poet Laureate of Tucson, Arizona in 2026. He is the author of the books *Reckon* (University of Arizona Press, 2026), *Sonoran Strange* (West End Press, 2015), and the ongoing *NoVoGRAFIAS* series (Artspeak Press). Logan is known for compelling, bilingual readings (English/Spanish) and multimedia performance art pieces, which have been featured at festivals in the US, Mexico, Colombia, the UK, and Germany. Holding collaboration as a core creative practice, he has contributed to a wide range of publishing, music, education, and community-centered, land-based projects. A Filipinx-American writer and aspiring game designer, Geramee is the Social Media Manager for the Kenyon Review and Poetry Editor at Tinderbox Poetry Journal. Their work has been featured in *Button Poetry*, *the Offing*, *Permanent Record: Poetics Towards the Archive* (Nightboat Books, 2025), *Indiana Review*, *The Journal*, *The Margins*, *The Fairy Tale Review*, *Essay Daily*, and elsewhere. They've won numerous awards, including a 2022 Academy of American Poets Prize, Booth Journal's 2022 Beyond the Margins prize, and second-place for Frontier Poetry's 2023 Hurt and Healing Prize. Parking Instructions

Disability Parking is available in the blue box area accessible off N. Herbert St. The blue arrow indicates the ramp access.



Green boxes indicate parking areas. During the time of our event, the parking restrictions on the signs will not apply.



A single line of parking is available along the wall on N Herbert Ave. Neighborhood parking is available on E 4th Street – please be mindful to park in open areas only.

Disability access is also available at the main entrance, but the parking on the street is not as convenient as in the blue box area.

Parking is challenging at best, but this map will help. Be patient and drive around the block to find parking.

The dark red arrow indicates the main entrance.
